


1. Summary of Concerns

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Summary of Concerns



Main Concerns

- Silver Creek overcrowding
- Future enrollment projections
- Safe access within capacity constraints (North of Tully)
- Existing boundary divisions in middle of local street (Aldrich)

Schools impacted by these concerns: SCHS, WCOHS and YBHS



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- No boundary changes and no expanded or additional facilities (other than those underway)
- No boundary changes, expand existing facilities and/or build an additional facility nearby

Options and Implications

1. No boundary changes and no expanded or additional facilities (other than those underway)

Results in Overcrowding

- a. Larger number of students in many classes
 - Not conducive to learning environment
 - Safety issues
 - Legal implications
 - Insufficient parking
- Perhaps double sessions
 - Requires double staff
 - Contractual issues with ESTA and CSEA
 - Possible bankruptcy of ESUHSD
- c. Facilities are not used optimally



No boundary changes, expand existing facilities and/or build an additional facility nearby

- Construction of additional facilities
 - Sufficient local funding for an additional facility is not available.
 - District wide surplus capacity makes ESUHSD ineligible for state funding of new facilities.
 - Not an Immediate solution. New buildings would be ready in 4-6 years. (land, design, permits, construction, etc.)

Options and Implications

3. Proposed boundary changes will result in:

- a. Adequate student enrollment in each school
- b. Improving safe access were feasible within capacities
- c. All currently enrolled students and incoming 9th graders, for the following school year, may remain in their present school until graduation (Grandfathering)

ESUHSD believes this is the most viable option





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Proposed Boundary Changes – Area #2a
