The Botball Robotics competition is not easy. It requires each team to build a robot using *legos*, to program a 37k microprocessor, and to connect the two into one operating unit. Robots score points using ping pong balls. The team with the most points wins and moves on in the competition.

#### East Side Receives Major Grant for School Reform

The district received a three hundred thousand dollar grant (\$300,000) from the Bay Area School Reform Collaborative (BASRC), a private non-profit organization that assists public schools in improving student achievement.

The focus of the grant is on developing data based continuous improvement processes throughout the district. James Lick, Oak Grove, Piedmont Hills, Santa Teresa, and W.C. Overfelt High Schools will participate in the grant.

In addition, the district administration must engage in reform activities. Last year the East Side Union High School District was one of nine districts to receive a small, pilot grant to work with BASRC to explore practical ways districts could support schools with reform. During the first-year pilot, districts (with BASRC assistance) examined ways of improving the collection and analyzing student achievement data, implementing standards, conducting assessments, and providing professional development for teachers. The district's role is to continue addressing these areas with the targeted schools.

Three of the districts schools, Oak Grove, Independence, and Santa Teresa, have been actively involved with BASRC since 1996. All three of these schools received BASRC grants, integrated reforms, and made progress in improving student achievement. In the new grant, Oak Grove and Santa Teresa have been designated as anchor schools and they will work with James Lick, Piedmont Hills, and W.C. Overfelt to support them as they make changes to improve.

The majority of the students receiving the scholarships will be going to San Jose State University, Santa Clara University, and UC/State colleges.


