BACKGROUND

Education Code Section 60119 requires that local Board of Education hold a public hearing and declare by resolution whether or not all students have access to sufficient textbooks and instructional materials consistent with the state curricular frameworks and standards. If the governing board finds an insufficiency, it must make known to the public the reasons for the insufficiency and take action to ensure that the situation is remedied within two years. This public hearing is intended to comply with this regulation.

Please be advised that the present California state per-pupil allocation for the purchase of textbooks and instructional materials is insufficient to provide each student with textbook and instructional support materials for each class for school year 2004-2005.

Resolution Regarding the Insufficiency of Textbooks and Instructional Materials

Resolution No. #2004/2005-13

WHEREAS Education Code 60119 (c) requires that under certain circumstances each Board of Education must hold a public hearing and determine through resolution whether each student has sufficient textbooks and/or instructional materials; and

WHEREAS the Board has adopted textbooks and instructional materials for East Side Union High School District which are consistent with the curricular frameworks adopted by the State Board of Education; and

WHEREAS there does not exist at all school sites operated by the East Side Union High School District sufficient supplies of textbooks and instructional materials consistent with the curricular framework adopted by the State Board of Education; and

WHEREAS funding from the State Department of Education *Instructional Materials Fund* and from the budgets of the departments involved is not sufficient to purchase a necessary supply of textbooks and instructional materials before the end of the 2004-2005 fiscal year.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that in compliance with Education Code 60119 (a)(2)(A), the East Side Union High School District will provide to classroom teachers, and to the public, information setting for the reasons for the insufficiency within two years.

- Energy management on his/her campus will be made a part of the principal's responsibility.
