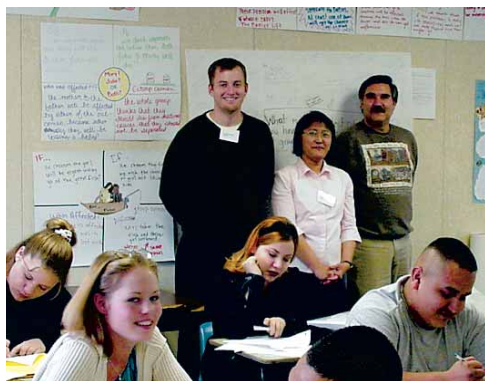


Andrew Hill Boys' Varsity Basketball Team Wins CCS Championship
