Robots to Break Ground for Information High School

Robots constructed by Foothill High School students will turn the soil at the site of the new Evergreen Valley High School to symbolize the groundbreaking for San Jose's first high school of the 21st century.

The high tech ceremony is scheduled for Tuesday, October 24, 2000, at 11AM at the southeast corner of the site at the end of Vintage Cress Drive off Quimby Road and Ruby Avenue. The East Side Union High School District Board of Trustees, Superintendent Joe Coto, Mayor Ron Gonzales and Congresswoman Zoe Lofgren will join the nationally recognized Foothill Robotics team as they initiate the construction of this information age high school.

Over 100 community members have responded that they will be there to witness the event. For the past year, several hundred staff, parents, students and community members have been involved in designing the new high school. Work teams have focused on the curricula, technology, best practices and governance. A second round of teams will meet in December to continue the process.

The public is invited to attend the groundbreaking. Refreshments will be served after a short ceremony.
