It's Early Childhood Development Center has earned statewide recognition: It has been rated among the best of thousands of early education programs in California, receiving a near-perfect overall score.





The AED program at ESUHSD is the first such program in a school district in the City of San Jose. There is a total of 41 AEDs installed throughout the district, increasing the heart safety of more than 26,000 students, as well as staff and parents visiting the schools.

This is part of a larger county initiative with partnerships and funding contributions from Supervisors Cindy Chavez and Joe Simitian, Racing Hearts, Health Trust, Sports Basement and Silicon Valley Leadership Foundation.


